## Parents Grievance Procedure

It is in the best interests of all parties that any school grievances are resolved as quickly as possible.

- Problems can be best resolved when raised informally at first. Any issues or complaints should therefore first be discussed with a **Class Teacher**.
- Where this course of action is considered inappropriate or unsuccessful, an appointment should be requested to discuss the issue with the **Headteacher**.
- If the matter remains unresolved a complaint can then be made in writing informing the **Chairman of Governors** (John Parker) via the school.
- Finally, if necessary, a written letter of complaint can be sent to The Education Dept., London Borough of Havering, Scimitar House, Eastern Road, Romford, RM1 3NH or this can be sent via the school.
