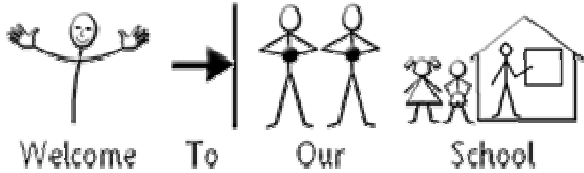




# CORBETS TEY SCHOOL WEEKLY NEWSLETTER
