My name is Ronnie Jackson and I am 10 years old. My mummy is helping me to write this letter to you. I have autism and I find writing letters very hard, but mummy is writing my words for you to clearly understand me.

I absolutely love cricket and adore the team I play for, which is part of Cricket for Change. For the past year, I have trained and played matches with the Cricket for Change visually impaired players, physically impaired players and players with learning disabilities, like myself. I train every Friday, and some Sundays for the Essex Moderate Learning Difficulty team.

Earlier this month I had some fantastic news. I have been selected to go to Jamaica next year to play against and meet other people with disabilities.

To prove I am truly a team player, I have to raise as much money as I can to enable myself and 25 other players to go (along with lots of carers). I wanted to ask if anyone would be able to sponsor me, and Cricket for Change so that I can go and have this wonderful experience.
